DECISION AND ORDER

Under section 4.5.2 of the Board's Transmission System Code (the "TSC"), transmitters are required to develop performance standards at the customer delivery point level and to file those standards for approval by the Board. On September 28, 2006, Great Lakes Power Limited ("GLPL") filed its proposed customer delivery point performance standards ("CDPPS") for Board approval.

The history of this proceeding is described in the Board's Decision and Order of June 6, 2007, in which the Board also ordered GLPL to revise its CDPPS and file a revised version with the Board. Specifically, the Board ordered GLPL to revise its CDPPS to incorporate proposals made by GLPL in its March 30, 2007 submissions made in response to submissions by Board staff and Hydro One Networks Inc., the sole intervenor in this proceeding.

On July 27, 2007, GLPL filed its revised CDPPS with the Board.

A discussion between GLPL and Board staff aimed at clarifying one aspect of GLPL's revised CDPPS resulted in GLPL filing a minor amendment to its July 27, 2007 CDPPS document on December 13, 2007. The amendment modifies the second sentence on page 4 by deleting the word "and" before the words "in 2009", such that the sentence would read as follows:

GLPL is committed to compare GLPL delivery point performance against the Hydro One delivery point performance standards in 2009, when GLPL has five (5) years of data.

The Board has reviewed GLPL's revised CDPPS, including the amendment made on December 13, 2007, and has determined that the revised document reflects and complies with the direction set out in the Board's June 6, 2007 Decision and Order. The Board therefore approves GLPL's CDPPS as revised on July 27, 2007 and as further revised on December 13, 2007. The Board reminds GLPL that its CDPPS, as approved, must now be posted on GLPL's website as required by section 4.5.5 of the TSC. The Board also reminds GLPL that, in accordance with the Board's June 6, 2007 Decision and Order, GLPL must report to the Board no later than the end of the first quarter of 2010 on the results of its assessment of its minimum performance standards and on whether GLPL intends to propose any material changes for review and approval by the Board.

THEREFORE THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

The "Customer Delivery Point Standards ("CDPPS")" filed by Great Lakes Power Limited on July 27, 2007 and amended on December 13, 2007 are approved.
